ALL FIELDS REGULATION 2 UMPIRE SYSTEM

GIRLS FAST PITCH RULES UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED

Read the statement EXACTLY as written. IF ANY PART of the statement is false, mark it false.

ABOUT FREQUENTLY MISSED QUESTIONS:

- An appeal play must be made before the next play or attempted play.
- When an obstructed runner is tagged between the two bases where the obstruction occurred, the ball is dead immediately.
- 3. The Flex may never play offense only.
- The plate umpire must report all changes, including courtesy runners, to the other team.

MORE ABOUT FREQUENTLY MISSED QUESTIONS:

- A Courtesy Runner runs for the pitcher in the third inning. The Courtesy Runner is eligible to bat for the pitcher later in the third inning.
- A Courtesy Runner runs for the pitcher in the third inning. The Courtesy Runner is eligible to bat for a player other than the pitcher later in the third inning.
- When the look-back rule is in effect, B1 walks and stops on first base. B1 steps off first base. B1 is not out if she immediately returns non-stop to first base or advances non-stop to second base.
- When the look-back rule is in effect, if B1 overruns first base and starts back to the base, B1 may attempt to advance to second base.

ABOUT NEW RULES:

- 9. A defensive conference is not charged when, after going to the pitcher's circle, the coach removes the pitcher from the game.
- The umpire will remove any bat that has burrs, dents and visible cracks from the game.
- 11. A player who is found wearing metal cleats shall be ejected if she has previously been warned for wearing metal cleats.
- 12. A clarification states that the pitcher must step on the pitcher's plate with her hands separated and the ball in the glove hand or the pitching hand.

MORE ABOUT NEW RULES:

- 13. A ball is added to the batter's count if the pitcher fails to pitch in 20 seconds after receiving the ball.
- 14. The pitcher is charged with an illegal pitch if the pitcher fails to pitch in 20 seconds after receiving the ball.
- 15. The Gorilla Gold drying agent is approved for use but must be kept in the pitcher's pocket when not being used.
- 16. The batter and all runners are awarded two bases when a fair batted ball deflects off the fence and strikes and fielder before going over the fence.

ABOUT A TAG:

17. A legal tag occurs when a fielder tags a runner with the ball while holding the ball securely in her glove.

- 18. A legal tag occurs when a fielder tags a runner with the ball while holding the ball securely in her throwing hand.
- A legal tag occurs when a fielder touches a runner with her glove while holding the ball in her throwing hand.
- 20. A fielder in possession of the ball may legally tag a base with any part of her body.

ABOUT APPEAL PLAYS:

- 21. An appeal play is a play on which an umpire may not make a decision until requested by the manager, coach or player.
- 22. With one out and with R2 on second and R3 on third base, the batter flies out to F8. R3 properly tags and crosses home plate. R2 does not tag and advances to 3rd. Then, after a live ball appeal, R2 is declared out. R3's run shall count.
- 23. A coach may appeal that a runner should be out for leaving her base prior to the release of the pitch.
- 24. A plate umpire may not ask the base umpire for help on a checked swing unless asked to do so by a manager, coach, or player.

ABOUT TEAM CONFERENCES:

- The offensive team is entitled to only one charged conference per inning.
- 26. The defensive team is entitled to only one charged conference per inning.
- 27. If the game goes into extra innings, unused defensive conferences are carried over and may be used in extra innings.
- 28. The plate umpire shall record all offensive and defensive conferences on his/her line-up card.

ABOUT TOUGH CALLS:

- 29. In terms of a batted ball, the batter's hands are considered part of the bat
- A batter who "freezes" and gets hit by a pitched ball may not be awarded first base.
- 31. On close tag plays, a runner who does not slide must be called
- 32. On a dropped third strike, a batter-runner is not permitted to take a few steps toward her dugout, and before entering dead ball territory, attempt to advance to first base.

ABOUT TAG-UPS:

- 33. With R2 as the sole runner, the plate umpire is responsible for appeals on R2's tag-up.
- 34. With R3 as the sole runner, the plate umpire is responsible for appeals on R3's tag-up.
- 35. With R1 on first and R2 on second base, the base umpire is responsible for appeals made on both R1 and R2.

36. With bases loaded, the plate umpire is responsible for appeals on both R2 and R3's tag-up.

ABOUT LIABILITY:

- 37. It is proper for an umpire to instruct a runner either to slide or not slide.
- 38. An umpire may give a player advice as to how she should treat an injury.
- 39. If it is discovered that the pitching distance is improper, the umpires shall have the pitching rubber corrected immediately, regardless of the playing situation.
- 40. It is acceptable for the plate umpire to place his hand on the catcher to measure the distance between the umpire and the catcher.

THE BATTER IS OUT WHEN:

- 41. She hits a fair ball with the bat a second time in fair territory and she is still in the batter's box and contact is made while the bat is in her hands.
- 42. She hits a fair batted ball and again hits the ball in fair territory while she has at least one foot completely on the ground out of the batter's box.
- 43. She drops the bat and the ball rolls against the bat in fair territory, and, in the umpire's judgment, there was no intent to interfere with the ball.
- 44. She makes contact with the ball on the follow through after missing the pitch on the initial swing.

ABOUT THE DESIGNATED PLAYER (DP) RULE:

- 45. The designated player is the player who is initially on the line-up card on the team's batting order but not in the defensive line-up.
- 46. The player who is listed in the tenth position in the line-up is defined as the Flex.
- 47. The DP and Flex positions are completely interchangeable and may be "flip-flopped."
- 48. If the Flex bats for the DP, the role of the DP is terminated for the remainder of the game.

ABOUT THIRD STRIKE RULE:

- 49. If the batter-runner runs in violation of the third strike rule and draws a throw from the catcher the ball is immediately dead.
- 50. The batter is automatically out after three strikes when first base is occupied with less than two out.
- 51. The batter-runner can legally touch either the colored or white portion of the base when a fielder makes a play from foul ground.
- 52. Any time the batter swings and misses for strike three, the umpire should bellow, "Strike three, the batter is out!"

ABOUT COLLISIONS:

- A runner who remains on her feet and crashes into a fielder who has the ball is out.
- The collision rule applies to a fielder who is about to receive a thrown ball.
- 55. A runner is always automatically ejected if she remains on her feet and crashes into a fielder.

56. The batter-runner is ejected if she crashes into the first baseman who is reaching for an errant throw in the baseline.

PLATE MECHANICS:

- 57. When a runner who attempts to score misses home and the catcher misses the tag, the plate umpire makes no call.
- 58. The plate umpire is responsible for ruling on the status of all fly balls.
- 59. With no runners on base, the plate umpire has fair/foul responsibility up to the front edge of first base.
- 60. On foul balls that either hit fencing or clearly go out of play, the plate umpire shall not verbalize or signal "foul ball" or "dead ball."

ABOUT INTERFERENCE:

- 61. Once a batted ball is deflected, a runner cannot be called out for interference unless the runner intentionally interferes.
- 62. When a runner prevents an infielder from catching a routine fair fly ball with ordinary effort, both the runner and batter are out.
- 63. It is umpire's interference if the umpire runs into a catcher after she has fielded a fair batted ball.
- 64. The ball is delayed-dead when a runner interferes with a fielder to give the fielder an opportunity to make another out on the play.

ABOUT RE-ENTRY:

- 65. Any player may leave the game and re-enter the game once.
- 66. Players who re-enter the game must occupy their original positions in the line-up.
- 67. A starting player and her substitute may not be in the line-up at the same time.
- 68. Once removed from the game, a starting pitcher may never return to the pitching position.


